

That 'I'm in Hokkaido' feeling

Nakashibetsu, Hokkaido, is in the center of Konsen Plateau. It has a pasture zone with green as far as the eye can see that is partitioned by Japanese larch windbreaks. A refreshing drive on the long, straight road that seems to divide the green plateau in two will reaffirm the fact that you are in Hokkaido.

The population, at 24,000 people, is extremely small. This large space has been controlled without interruption by nature itself since primeval times. The Shiretoko Peninsula, which has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is just a stone's throw away. Many birds migrate here without hesitation.

From Uramashu Observatory, visitors can see a hidden view of Lake Mashu that has charmed many a traveler.
